About Us

ausEE Inc. is Australia's peak national support and patient advocacy organisation representing Australians living with an eosinophilic disease, with an established focus on eosinophilic gastrointestinal diseases (EGIDs).

Founded in 2009, ausEE Inc. is an Australia wide health promotion charity, registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission and endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office as a deductible gift recipient.





OUR CAUSE

Eosinophilic gastrointestinal diseases (EGIDs) are chronic inflammatory diseases that occur when a type of white blood cell, called an eosinophil (pronounced ee-oh-sin-oh-fill), is found in increased numbers in the gastrointestinal tract. In some individuals, eosinophils accumulate in the gut, potentially in response to drugs, food, airborne allergens and other unknown triggers. This infiltration can cause inflammation and tissue damage. An endoscopy with biopsies is required to confirm the diagnosis of an EGID.



The most known type of EGID is eosinophilic oesophagitis (EoE), where the eosinophilic infiltration is in the oesophagus, which causes inflammation that can lead to scarring, strictures and narrowing of the oesophagus, putting people at risk of food impactions (food getting stuck in the oesophagus). The current estimated prevalence of EoE is 1 in 1-2,000 individuals and rising. EGIDs are chronic diseases that require ongoing management and monitoring with endoscopies and repeat biopsies. There is no cure and more research is needed.

Our Mission

ausEE's mission is to improve the lives of those affected by eosinophilic diseases through providing support, evidence-based information, resources, advocacy and by campaigning to raise awareness and funds for further research in Australia.

- To be the catalyst for further research in the medical field; and ultimately find a cure.
- To be the peak eosinophilic diseases organisation in Australia, a trusted place for people to turn to for support and information.

We understand that eosinophilic diseases have a significant impact on health and wellbeing and that many individuals and families are facing on-going social, financial, education and employment issues because of them. Historically, EGIDs have been a rare disease, however, the prevalence of EGIDs and EoE is becoming more significant as diagnosis techniques and awareness increase. Globally, EoE has rapidly become a major cause of upper gastrointestinal morbidity.

From our inception in 2009 through to end of 2021 we have been a 100% volunteer run charity. Future Goals

Over the years demand for our services has continued to increase, placing significant strain on our limited resources. We receive no Government funding and have been advocating including through <u>pre-budget submissions</u> to have the voices heard of people with eosinophilic diseases. Support is critical for ausEE to continue to provide support and services to Australians living with eosinophilic diseases and to achieve these important objectives. Support will strengthen our capacity, reach and impact to ensure our sustainability so that all individuals, families and carers of those with eosinophilic diseases receive the appropriate information, optimal care and support.

- TIMELY DIAGNOSIS The development of a referral/diagnosis pathway for EGIDs in Australia
 will improve the timeliness of patient diagnosis. There is also a great need to increase health
 professional awareness of EGIDs, especially to those in regional, rural and remote locations to
 improve diagnosis timeframes so effective treatment can commence to improve quality of life.
- STANDARDS OF CARE GUIDELINES People living with an EGID experience inconsistencies in
 the health care they receive in managing their EGID. The development of Standards of Care
 Guidelines is crucial to providing person-centred care and is pivotal to achieve best clinical
 practice for EGIDs as well as influencing and improving quality of care and patient outcomes.
- INFORMATION RESOURCES ausEE provides evidence-based information on EGIDs to individuals, families, key stakeholders and the general community to help raise awareness and understanding and provide practical resources to assist those impacted with an EGID. We have an important goal to increase our coverage to encompass all eosinophilic diseases.
- SUPPORT SERVICES Living with an EGID greatly impacts on quality of life; physically, socially and mentally. Due to the complexity of these diseases individuals and families can feel very isolated and can benefit from ongoing support. As the only patient support organisation for EGIDs in Australia, and additionally providing support to the tube feeding community, we play a vital role in providing support networks to improve patient wellbeing. We aim to grow our support services with a dedicated focus to reach more in regional, rural and remote locations and to broaden our support networks to cover all eosinophilic diseases.
- COMMUNITY OUTREACH Awareness raising activities are vital to assist in an improved pathway to diagnosis and to provide greater knowledge and understanding of the impact of eosinophilic diseases to the wider community. ausEE Inc. is the peak patient advocacy organisation providing Australia wide awareness and developing and promoting more awareness and education campaigns continue to be important objectives.



CONSORTIUM OF EOSINOPHILIC GASTROINTESTINAL DISEASE RESEARCHERS

ausEE Inc. is a patient advocacy group of the Consortium of Eosinophilic Gastrointestinal Disease Researchers (CEGIR). In September 2021, we invited our members to complete a survey to provide their patient questions and research ideas.

CEGIR researchers investigate and answer these patient questions and ausEE and our international patient advocacy group partners attend fortnightly CEGIR meetings and subsequently share these responses, back to our members and the community. We are appreciative of CEGIR's dedication!



2021 RESEARCH PUBLICATION

In September 2018, ausEE members were invited to participate in a research project to learn more about genomic research and to share their views and perspectives about who should be involved in shaping the future of this research. The research included an online survey followed by a two-week online discussion group for participants and a second online survey. This research was led by Jack Nunn from La Trobe University. In March 2021, an article titled 'Involving people affected by a rare condition in shaping future genomic research' was published in Research Involvement and Engagement journal.

ausEE board members, Kylie Gwynne and Sarah Gray were both co-authors of this research publication.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2021

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.
